THE MARITIME NATIONAL PARK ASSOCIATION WORKS TO BRING SAN FRANCISCO'S MARITIME HISTORY TO LIFE FOR MILLIONS OF VISITORS EACH YEAR.

HERE'S HOW WE DID IT:

In 2022, as we began to renew in-person offerings put on hold during Covid, we retained many of our virtual programs to ensure continued access to a broader audience.

In-person collaborations with San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park included the Kenichi Horie reception at the San Francisco Maritime Museum, along with the triumphant return of the Moby-Dick 24-hour Marathon. The lead up to the marathon showcased an incredible series of programs, lectures and events at the Maritime Museum and the Maritime Research Library, exploring and celebrating the influence of Herman Melville's classic novel.

Our education department was also able to provide high-quality learning opportunities to local youth with the renewal of our Youth Boat Building Program. This program gives at-risk high school students the opportunity to earn their high school diploma through project-based learning. Students use math, hand tools, problem solving and teamwork to build a wooden boat from scratch over the course of the semester.

Over at the USS *Pampanito*, in addition to our scout overnights, several hundred guests attended and participated in our Lost Boat Ceremony at Historic Pier 45, commemorating submariners lost at sea, a tradition that is both heartfelt and moving.

We also continued to offer virtual tours of the USS *Pampanito* online, virtual education programs, and our virtual sea music programs. Our virtual sea music programs were available throughout the year, and many participants have remarked at how meaningful these programs have been in retaining a sense of connectedness through changing and uncertain times.
