We help make these resources available to the public through education programs, special events, fundraising, and community outreach.



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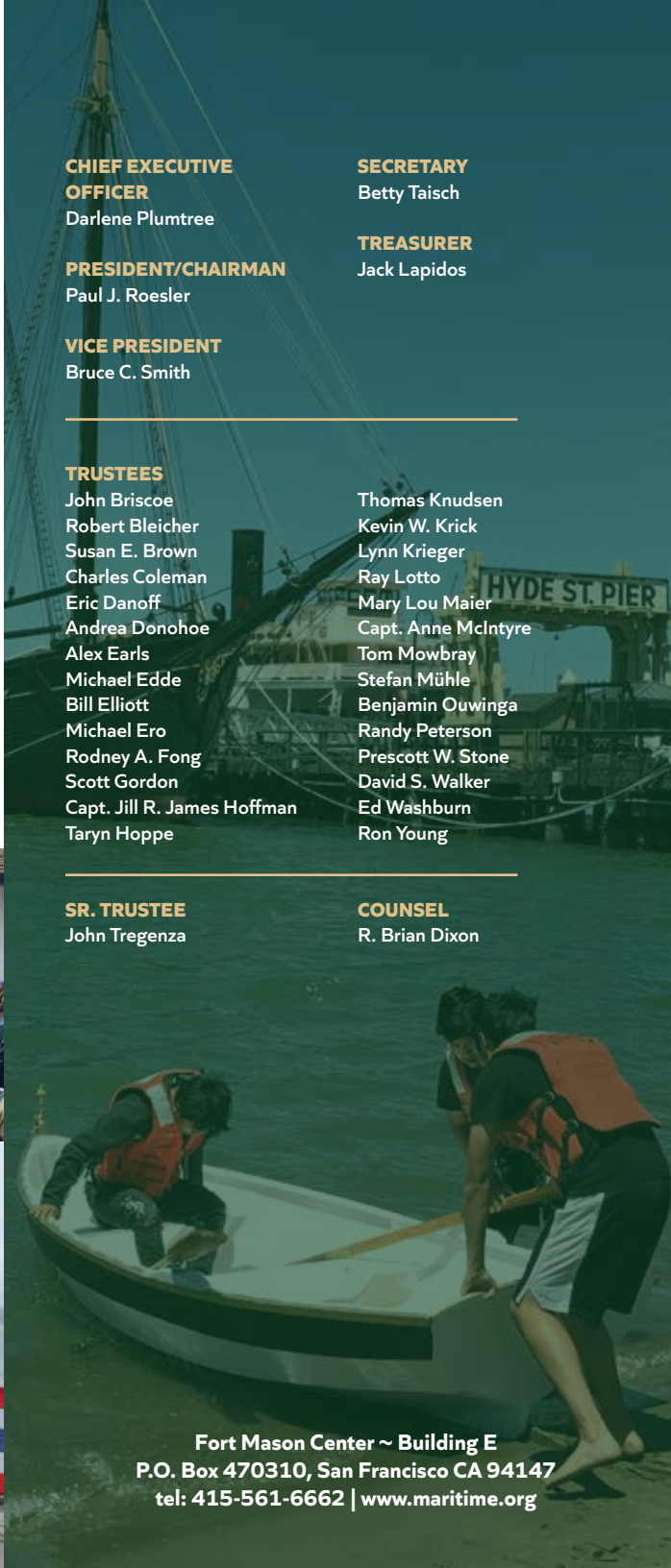

- We were proud to continue our education programs, welcoming students to both Hyde Street Pier and the USS *Pampanito* at Pier 45. At Aquatic Park, our Youth Boat Building program, in collaboration with Downtown High School's Get Out And Learn (GOAL) project, crafted two beautiful student-built boats.

HERE'S HOW WE DID IT:

2024 was an eventful year for the San Francisco Maritime National Park Association and San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park.

Over the course of the year, we partnered with the park to bring many exciting events to the community. These included a Labor History Talks series at the San Francisco Maritime Museum and the much-anticipated return of the San Francisco Sea Music Festival. The festival showcased workshops and performances by internationally and locally renowned artists across five stages, and a boat show in Aquatic Park cove. We also brought back the popular 24-hour Moby Dick Marathon to the great delight of literary and theater fans.

Over at the USS *Pampanito* several hundred guests attended and participated in our Lost Boat Ceremony at Historic Pier 45, commemorating submariners lost at sea and featuring speeches by veterans, along with an official military color guard. October brought the high-energy of Fleet Week to Pier 45, and November saw a dazzling turnout for the Annual Maritime Ball at the St. Francis Yacht Club, with exceptional musical performers and an evening of fine dining and celebration.

Our education department continued to provide high-quality learning opportunities and scholarships for local youth with our Youth Boat Building Program. We were also proud to revive our Explorer program aboard the tall ship *Gas Light* and renew our Maritime Summer Camp from June through August, providing hands-on maritime learning experiences to dozens of children. We closed out the year with the launch of a student-crafted skiff and an issue of our beloved *Sea Letter* magazine.

Overall, we were thrilled by the widespread support and community participation in our events. This was complemented by our education programs, which remained innovative and helped bring maritime history to life for countless Bay Area children and youth.
